BAY STATE RINGER REPORT – HOLIDAY SEASON, 2018



HELLO TO ALL – It's been a long time! This has been a busy year and now we are ready to welcome in a new one. Happy Holidays and Merry Christmas to all of you from the Massachustts Executive Board – we hope for a good New Year in 2019. We already have almost 30 members, several of them new members, so we are looking forward to some great competition – new formats and new membership options.

On that note, the first new option in 2019 is for non-sanctioned pitchers to pitch in ONE sanctioned tournament. They will not be eligible for NHPA awards but CAN win, place, or show AND they will get their feet wet while obtaining an average to continue in tournaments if they so wish. There are other incentives for new members, especially, in our state. Ask Stacey Perron, Ken Corrigan, and Joe Hansen about those! Essentially, they receive their membership card free, once, if they participate in 2 sanctioned events during their first year. Not that hard when you consider that participating in a sanctioned league is one "event".

Awards given out this year were to Scott Bedard for being Most Improved from 2016 – 2017. He improved 6.85% and is over 50% ringers now. This from a guy who has 2 small children and rarely finds time to practice. Some natural talent there, methinks!! Rookie of the Year for 2017 was Ken Corrigan who participated in 4 tournaments, travelled to Keene, NH for the New England tournament on Labor Day weekend (twice now!), and averaged over 21% in his first year.

A NEW, prestigious award came into being in 2018, thanks to Alan Fauteux and his generous Booster donation. The award is the Al Cardinale Sportsmanship award, named for Alan's father-in-law. Voting was held on-line and the first honoree was – *drum roll*! - **RICK HOWE!** A popular choice, Rick has been in horseshoes since he was a mere child. He is one of the most positive voices out there -Congratulations to Rick! And, thank you again, Alan Fauteux. The 2018 State Tournament struggled through a major rainstorm but **was** completed in Belchertown. Ray Bedard is the Men's State Champion while Theresa Howe successfully defended her Women's crown. Dave Bliss Jr. is the new Elder State Champion. Nice pitching! Next year's State Singles tournament will be held in Hamilton on their newly renovated (Yes!!) courts. They put together a nice little video to show the work in progress and after it was completed- catchy video, nice work, Shelly Martinez! It will be nice to visit Hamilton again for the StateTournament – get a carpool full of pitchers to travel up there next August! The State Doubles will be held in Belchertown. The Loon Pond H.C. will have their normal first of the year Doubles tournament later in the year, on June 1st, but their Friday Night Challenge and Hamilton's first singles tournament will both be held in May. The full outdoor schedule will be available on the New England website sometime in early March so keep your eyes peeled for that. Horseshoe Manias will be held about once a month in Lakeville. Many of the events, scheduled or added on, are posted on Facebook and on the New England website, <u>newenglandhorseshoes.net</u>

It may be quiet for most of you now but winter pitching continues in E. Hartford, CT, Thompson, CT, Gardner, MA and in Lewiston, ME. All but Gardner hold sanctioned events and casual leagues along with Doubles play on some weekends. That winter pitching keeps you going AND it is nice to see horseshoe friends in the winter as well as in the summer.
